

- Enhanced awareness

Key Regulatory Actions

- Moving (slowly) on agent / broker misbehavior
- Loosening the EHB standard
- Mental Health Care Access



The Broader Commercial Market



Medicaid Redetermination

The continuous coverage requirement ended March 31, 2023. Where do we stand now?

As of June 14, 2024, roughly 24% of Medicaid enrollees have lost coverage due to redeterminations



22% of enrollees yet to be evaluated

Will likely continue into 2025 in some states

How has it gone?

70% of terminations are procedural

At least some appear to be re-enrolling

The big question: Where are people going?

Data here is sparse
